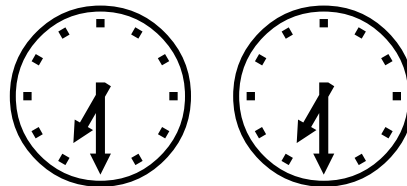

FIRE PREVENTION MONTH

- Always stay in the kitchen when cooking and use tested and approved cooking equipment.
- Never leave cooking food on the stovetop unattended, and keep a close eye on food cooking inside the oven.
- Keep cooking areas clean and clear of combustibles (potholders, towels, rags, drapes & food packaging)
- Keep things and children away from cooking areas. Enforce a "kid-free zone" of three feet around the stove. Keep pets from underfoot & off cooking surfaces.
- Wear short, close fitting or tightly rolled sleeves when cooking.
- Never use a wet oven mitt as it could present a scald danger.
- Always keep a potholder, oven mitt & lid handy. If a small fire starts in a pan or the stove, put on an oven mitt and smother the flames by carefully sliding the lid over the pan. Turn off the burner. Don't remove the lid until completely cool. Never pour water on a grease fire & never discharge a fire extinguisher onto a pan fire, as it can spray or shoot grease, actually spreading the fire.
- In an oven fire, turn off the heat & keep the door closed.
- In a microwave fire, keep the door closed & unplug. Have it serviced before using.
- Never leave BBQ grills unattended while in use. Keep grills at least 3' away from other objects.
- Store matches & lighters in a locked cabinet.
- Keep space heaters at least 3' away from things that can burn.
- Have a service person inspect chimneys, fireplaces, wood & coal stoves and central furnaces once a

year.

- Never leave burning candles unattended.
- Always use stable candle holders made of material that won't catch fire, such as metal, glass, etc.
- Store Gasoline in a garage or shed in a container approved for gasoline storage.
- Never bring or use gasoline indoors; and use it as a motor fuel only.
- Don't plug in too many appliances at once.
- Make a fire escape plan for your family. Find 2 exits out of every room & pick a meeting place outside. Practice!
- Install smoke alarms on every level of your home & test them monthly.
- Teach everyone to "stop, drop & roll!"
